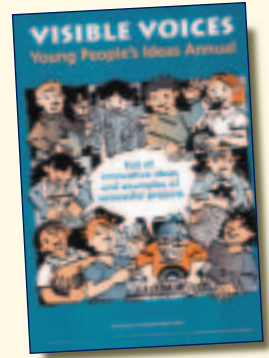

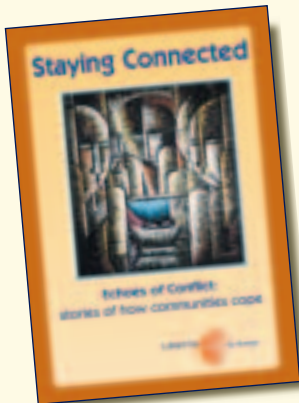

■ Staying Connected: Echoes of Conflict – stories of how communities cope

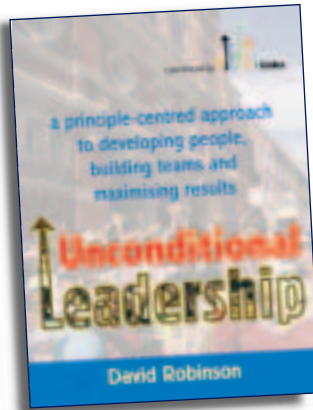

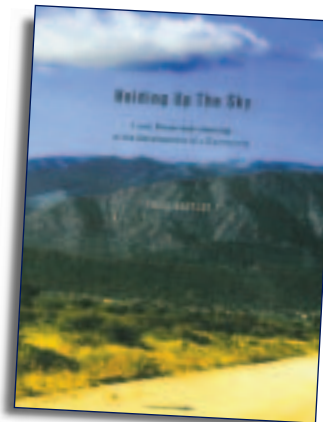
